FACT CHECKING AND VISUAL CONTENT VERIFICATION

Fact-Checking and Visual content verification is the process of verifying the factual accuracy of information, statements, images or Videos It is one of the important skill in order to check the of News. authenticity



For the uninitiated, distinguishing between original and manipulated images and video is difficult. Fact checking and Visual Content venfication helps to correct perceptions among citizens as well as discourage spreading fake news. How good one should be at detecting manipulated images and videos?

Simple steps to detect fake news:

- 1. Consider the source Click away from the story to investigate the site, its mission and its contact information.
- 2 Read Beyond Headlines can be outrageous in an effort to get clicks.
- 3. Check the author, do a quick search on the author. Are they credible? Are they from real? 4. Determine if the info given actually supports the story. 5. Check the date of old news stories which were reposted again. Check whether it is relevant to current events. 6. Is it a Joke? If it is too outlandish, it might be satire. 7. Research the site and author to be sure. Better information leads to better decision making

There are various applications and websites for fact checking. visual content (video, photo), and audio verification such as ChromeLens, InVID Verification Plugin, PolitiFact, FactCheck.org. Snopes, Sci Check, NPR FactCheck, and so on. This applications helps people to check for the accuracy and authenticity of the news, posts and information that goes viral on social media. applications and websites also helps in verification of visual content and audio files as well.

Media convergence: News at one' s fingertip



INTERVIEW WITH NEWS ANCHOR

Student Reporters Carol P and Vidya K interviewed Journalist Harish Nagaraju, News Anchor in Digvijaya News Channel. Excerpts of the interview....

What led you to pursue a career journalism? Few individuals become journalists and it's not usually by choice; sometimes it just happens. Studying journalism and becoming a journalist are two separate things; becoming a journalist by practise is a whole another thing. My entry into the journalism field is by chance. I've

been working in the media for 22

years, spanning a decade.

What did you do before joining the Digvijay Channel, and in which year was that? Prior to that, I worked for all India radio, the Hindustan times, the Reliance media network, and in News18 as a Senior Assistant Editor. When FM radio initially entered the Indian market in 2001.

I was part of the first batch.

What difficulties did you encounter when attempting to your publish story? We face new issues every day because we are glued to the news and never get to sit back and unwind since we are constantly in scorching chairs. Every narrative we hear, we just don't see that way, and leave it there. To be a journalist, you have to go deeply and understand how complex the issue is. We must choose a story that is realistic since, contrary to popular belief, journalism is impossible. When you work as a journalist, you must be aware of reality, have the curiosity. If you are an anchor and thrill to learn what it

interest to learn more.

What, in your opinion, is the most crucial information that today's young people who wish to work in journalism should be aware

Time sense, present sense, and common sense are the three senses that journalists should have. Because a journalist should be aware of what we talk about, how much we talk about it, and what we should talk about.

How important is to verify the facts?

Fact checking of news is very important to know whether the news is true or not. We need to, evaluate the story's depth, reality and specific facts to broadcast

What qualifications are needed for working in the media? You should be able to speak very well. You should be proficient in writing, in order for them to learn. All we need for a journalist is handwriting, language, clarity, vocabulary, how they say things, diction, analysing power, and translation. Henna for beginners

The first step is to trace your hand onto the paper. I recommend using a pencil to outline your hand first, so that you can erase any mistakes. Be sure to spread your fingers far enough so that you can easily get the pencil in between your fingers. Now you can fill your hand with designs and patterns like Common motifs found in henna hand designs as flowers, paisley, tendrils, stars, vines, spirals, leaves, water drops, criss-crosses, waves, and more. Henna designs on fingers, the patterns on your fingers will go from your fingertip to the top of your palm.

Henna designs on the palm gives a wide open space for creative expression. It commonly involves an abstract design that emanates out from the center, like a mandala. To create a design, pinpoint the center of the palm and start with a dot, a circle, a spiral, a flower, a star... any symbol or image that you like. Then continue adding designs that radiate out from that central point.

Henna designs on the wrist are horizontal pattern that goes across from one side to the other. After a lot of practices with pencil on a paper you can check few tutorial on YouTube how to draw pattern step by step for beginners and try it out with a henna cone on paper and then you can draw henna on hand.

Pencil art is one of the oldest and most popular forms of artwork still in use today. It can be created with just a piece of paper, pencil and an eraser. But despite its simplicity, pencil art can be incredibly complex and beautiful.
