### **ORIENTATION**

The year began with an Orientation of the First-year degree students on the 21<sup>st</sup> of October 2021. The program began with a prayer and a bible reading. The Principal, Prof Esther Prasanna Kumar welcomed and addressed both the students and parents followed by the introduction of all members of the faculty-teaching and non-teaching. ### **ACTIVITIES ORGANISED BY THE STUDENT COUNCIL**



• World Book Day was observed on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of April 2022.



# • World Earth Day



There were 4 winners for the best out of waste competition and the winner are as:


- 1. Sana K (bird feeder) 3 BCA

## • IDP EDUCATION TALK


