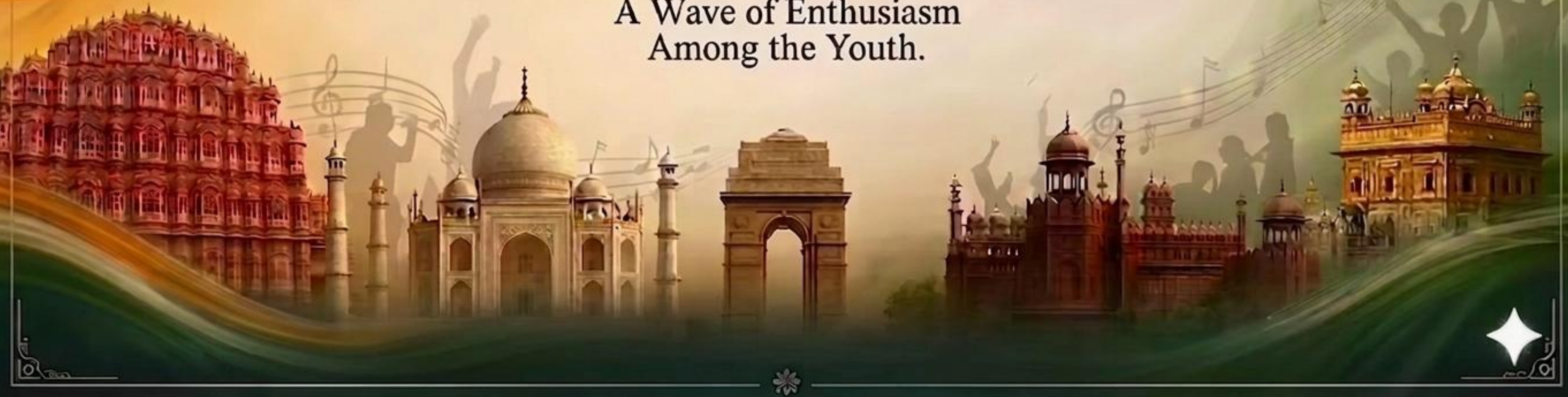

The celebration provides students with a platform to showcase their talents while expressing ideas of patriotism, unity, culture and responsible citizenship.

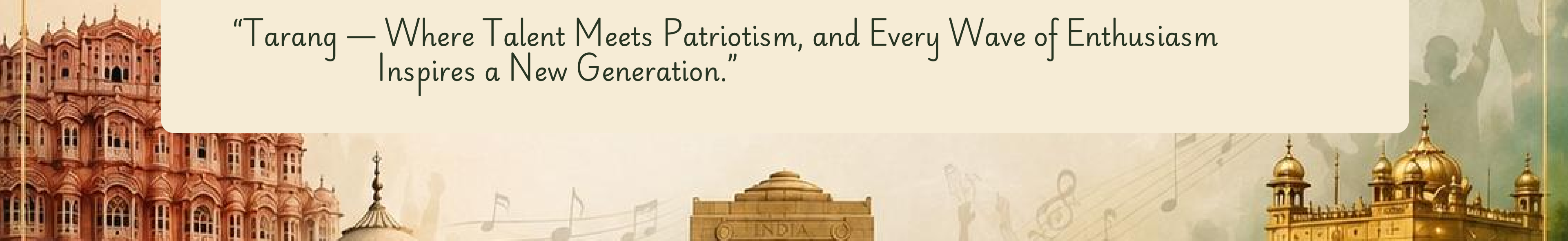


Why Tarang?
